#### LIP Intervention

■ Ms. Stephanie wanted to share in the spirit of gratitude this month, how thankful she is for the PTC and the joy she has working with the kiddos. "The PTC funds my position at Lake Forest and allows me to work with amazing students! In LIP the 2-5th graders have improved so much this trimester. Their Lexile scores show it!! In first grade we are working on sight words, cvc, and blending."

#### Garden

- Lunch time in the garden is run by parent volunteers. The garden is open Mon-Fri for all grades 1<sup>st</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> and there has been a huge increase in attendance this year. Currently 10-30 students attend from each grade level. 13% of students are SDC students and 80% of them engage in the lunch time garden program.
- Many holiday parties are held in the garden area. On Halloween Day, a parent volunteer, Kelli McDonald organized and booked three class parties in the garden with games and activities.
- In Sept. all 1st grade classes enjoyed their annual Apple Day and in October they each had their Pumpkin Patch Day in the garden as well.
- Last Spring, Eagle Scout Jack Oby completed his Eagle Scout project in the Lake Forest Garden. All of our garden beds were damaged and infested with tree roots from the trees around the outside of the garden. The project included the demolition of six wood beds and replaced them with water trough garden beds all with new irrigation! These new beds are so much easier to garden in for teachers, volunteers, and most of all the students!

- Our garden lessons are M-F all science based hands on learning. A HUGE thank you to the PTC for funding an amazing assistant Amy Burvant! She has been so helpful with all the lessons. Currently we teach 5-6 classes per week. Our Sign Up Genius calendar is booked through MAY!! We are currently preparing all our garden beds for winter veggies and plants.
- We will hold a plant, seed, and garden ornament sale in December. Date to be determined when we return from break.
- We applied for two more grants and should have an update in December.
